High schools invited to submit works of excellence for Iluka Visions

The Iluka Visions High School Exhibition will return to Bunbury Regional Art Galleries this October.

Entries are now open to high schools across the South West region.

Schools are invited to submit works of artistic excellence created by students in Years 7-12 for consideration.

BRAG Education Officer Michele Grimston said a team of art professionals will then visit schools to select works for the exhibition.

“It’s a wonderful opportunity for us to get out into the community, and see the fantastic standard of work which is being produced across our region’s schools,” Ms Grimston said.

“It’s really extraordinary the level of talent that is out there, and we are so delighted to be able to support our next generation of artists through this exhibition.”

Works that are selected will be professionally framed where appropriate and hung in BRAG’s premier gallery space for the October exhibition, which is made possible through the support of Iluka Resources.

“The continued support of Iluka Resources to deliver this annual exhibition is invaluable,” BRAG director Julian Bowron said.

“It allows us to present these works to a professional standard and offer the experience of being part of a professional exhibition to these students, which may influence their decision to pursue a career in the arts.”

Prizes will be awarded across all year levels at the opening event on October 14.

Students in Year 11 and 12 also have the chance to apply for a prestigious internship at the Perth Institute of Contemporary Art (PICA) to coincide with the 2017 Hatched – National Graduate Exhibition, to help further their career in the arts.
